Apprenticeship (up to 5 years)

What is an apprenticeship?

- A paid job with hands-on experience, and training while you work
- University of Lincoln is the only academic provider for the theory part of the apprenticeship; 20% paid hours spent on training
- Course starts Jan 2021, with entry points in January and September
- Course fees are funded through the apprenticeship levy
- Non-levy paying employers contribute 5% of the costs of the fees (£1350)
- Apprentices must be in a role that allows them to develop skills, knowledge and behaviours to complete the apprenticeship
- Can be a new or an existing employee

What is an apprenticeship?

- Partnership between employer, university and apprentice
- Contracts setting out expectations
- A workplace mentor helps support their development
- Ongoing monitoring and portfolio development with regular meetings between mentor, apprentice & academic staff
- Complete MA Heritage Conservation after about 4.5 years, then enter the gateway for final assessment for the apprenticeship award
- Need to show they meet knowledge skills and behaviours for the end point assessment

MA Heritage Conservation

Level 7 Cultural Heritage Conservator Apprenticeship

Entry Requirements

Undergraduate degree in any subject, or equivalent professional experience.
Employers select candidates in discussion with UoL.

Duration of Studies

4.5 years to MA + 6 months preparing for EPA

Accreditation of prior learning may be possible to provide a shorter route e.g. for those with a BA in conservation.

Delivery of Content

Year 1 & 2 One day/week in Lincoln during semester

Year 3-4 Two block teaching weeks/year in Lincoln.

Year 5 Tutorials with a dissertation supervisor (could be held by Skype if the student prefers).

Conservation projects

Students work on a wide range of conservation projects from museums, churches, historic properties and private owners

Conservation placements and volunteering in a range of different institutions

- 12 weeks as part of BA course Jan-Apr
- Other dates as voluntary work

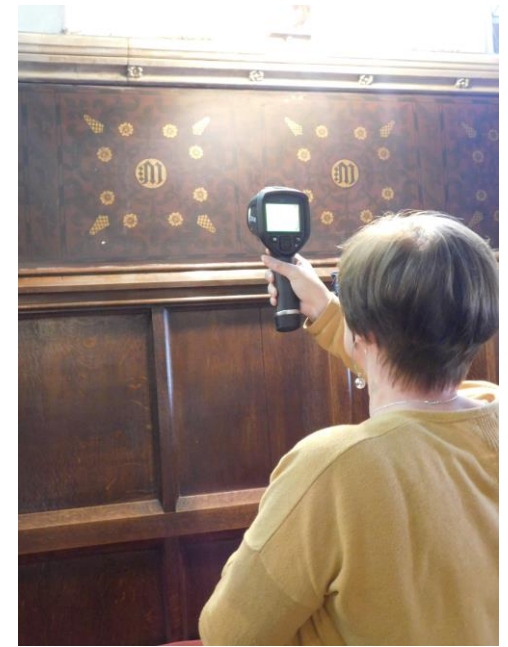
